Codes of Conduct

Code for Players

Play for enjoyment, not just to win

Never argue with the referee

Control your temper

Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your teams performance will benefit, and so will your own.

Be a good sport. Applaud all good play, whether by your team, or your opponents.

Respect your opponent. Treat all players like you would like to be treated.

At the final whistle applaud and thank your opponent and the referee for the match.

Win with humility, lose with dignity

Respect the facility which you are using, and always leave it the way you found it.

Code for Coaches

Remember that young people need a coach they can respect. Be generous with your praise when it is deserved, and always set a good example.

Remember that young players play for fun and enjoyment, and that winning is only part of it.

Never ridicule or yell at players for making mistakes or losing a match

Insist on fair and disciplined play. Do not tolerate foul play, fighting or foul language. Be prepared to take off an offending player.

Never criticise the referee during or after a match in front of players or spectators.

Be in control of your players at all times and ensure that they behave in a way that brings credit, not criticism to your club.

Code for Parents

Remember that young people are involved in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.

Always encourage your child to play to the laws of the game

Never ridicule or yell at players for making a mistake or losing a match

Remember that children learn best by example

Do not publicly question the referee's judgement or their honesty.

Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from rugby.

Recognise the value and importance of volunteer coaches and referees. They give their time and resources to provide recreational activities for your children.

Code for Spectators

Remember that although young people play organised sports, they are not miniature international rugby players.

Be on your best behaviour. Do not use profane language, or harass players, coaches or referees.

Applaud good play by both teams.

Condemn the use of violence in all forms.

Verbal abuse of players or referees cannot be accepted. Players and referees are not fair targets for ignorant behaviour.
